Items needed include: canned meats, tuna fish, pasta, rice, tomato sauce, cereal, canned fruit (snack-sized), disposable utensils, toiletries (small

sized), paper and plastic shopping/grocery bags, diapers, toilet paper and paper towels. A more detailed list of needs is posted on the bulletin board in the Narthex. Donations to the pantry may be left in the basket at the back of the church or dropped off at the UCM office on Fordson Road.
