**Nurturing Families Return to St. Mark's September 24<sup>th</sup>**. In cooperation with Fairfax County, St. Mark's has provided an opportunity for families to discover new ways of communicating and surviving today's challenges. We are

sponsoring the Spanish language classes, and delivering a meal seven of the 14 evenings they are meeting through December. The first class is September 24<sup>th</sup>, and we are looking for cooks and salad makers. We have found that it takes at least six people to make the dinner happen. David Boyd and Kathy Hughes are our Points of Light, and Contact. We will have a sign-up sheet in the Narthex. Dinners vary from being prepared at St. Mark's to being a pot luck. Those who help prepare and serve also share in the meal. The nights we are cooking are: September 24<sup>th</sup> - the "Kick-Off," October 8<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup>, November 19<sup>th</sup>, and December 10<sup>th</sup>.

Again this year, St. Mark's will piggy back with Nurturing Families, and will spend four Wednesday nights in October, "Facing Life's Toughest Questions". This is an ALPHA-based program of presentation by one of our clergy, followed by discussion. All are invited to share in the meal at 6:30, and then continue to the program, at 7:15.
