Reading from Jonah 4

“Should I not be concerned about Nineveh?” Do you not want to see greater things than these?

That challenge is still a part of who we are. Amid all the anxiety and fear we have about the world which characterizes much of our lives today; the question is still being asked: “Should I not pity Nineveh?”

It's a question we need to live with, because I suspect that most of us have yet to take Jonah's lesson to heart. Like him, we are all being called by God to do things which deep down we may disagree with. But God is calling us to not only the unavoidable but what is right and wise and good. We have to ask for grace so that we can see the world as God sees it and to love the world as God loves it.

The Book of Jonah teaches us something new. It teaches us the lesson that was lived out in the lives of the disciples and on the Cross of Jesus. Pray for the peace of Nineveh, the unlovable city. Pray and act for the peace of this community, that we be ready and willing to seek the justice and the love of God in the world. And those who do so will be blessed, "for they shall be called children of God."
