## **GENERAL CONVENTION of the Episcopal Church, USA**

The 78<sup>th</sup> General Convention 2015 will be held June 25 – July 3 at the Salt Palace Convention Center in Salt Lake City, UT (Diocese of Utah).

The Episcopal Church's General Convention is held every three years, and is the bicameral governing body of the Church. It comprises the House of Bishops, with upwards of 200 active and retired bishops, and the House of Deputies, with clergy and lay deputies elected from the 109 dioceses and three regional areas of the Church, at more than 800 members. At this General Convention we will elect a new Presiding Bishop to succeed Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts Schori. Those nominated are listed below. In addition, there will be much discussion on the future of the Episcopal Church, USA and how our mission in the world will be conducted.

The [Joint Nominating Committee for the Election of the Presiding Bishop](#) May 1 announced the names of the bishops it will nominate this summer to succeed Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts Schori. The four names will be formally submitted to the General Convention during a joint session on June 26, the day prior to the day set for the election by the House of Bishops of the 27<sup>th</sup> presiding bishop.
