It’s been another great year for St. Mark’s Mission Team as we’ve prepared for our journey to be with the Dine’ (Navajo) People. Through the hard work of the team and those supporting them, I believe we have, as of today, raised the funds necessary to make the trip! This hasn’t been easy. We’re deeply grateful for the support and prayers that we have received. We pray not only for a safe journey, but that we will be able to share our story when we return so that others may know the blessings we experience.

When we consider the opportunity for ministry, one of the most profound references is in the Old Testament story about David (Samuel, 1:16). The passage describes the selection of David as God’s anointed. The key verse that defines how God sees each of us comes from Verse 7: "But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance...for the Lord does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." There are many things about David that are disturbing. The reader could sincerely ask why God chose such a person. But Samuel was led by God to anoint David as king of Israel because David loved the Lord and would serve the people in God’s name. David’s heart was good, even though his actions often were not. Eventually, it was his heart that redeemed his actions.

Giving our lives in service to others goes against the grain of self-preservation or human survival. To move beyond oneself means to become vulnerable to what others may think about you, or how they may act towards you. God asks us to seek a new relationship through the example of love, friendship and faith first given to us. We are blessed when we have known the heart of another. It can often overcome the things that we do in anger or stupidity. God’s love comes through those relationships. I have seen His love moving through the lives of each member of this mission team.

I want to thank Yuris Guzman, who has so ably picked up the tasks and responsibilities of leadership after The Rev. Meredith Heffner’s departure in January. I also thank the adults who are coming; Russell Bradley, Bill Baker, Reuben Geisner, Linda Larson, and Michaelene Miller. Please keep us in your prayers in the coming weeks, and may we greet one another in peace, July 2nd!
