The beheading of John the Baptist. Quite a gory little story when you think about it. This little piece from Mark is our reading for Sunday and is the only vignette from the gospels we have that does not discuss Jesus. Mark has placed it smack in the middle of the story of the sending out of the twelve and their return. Almost as if Mark felt he needed to get this information in his gospel and did not know where else to stick it. There seems to be no logical reason for this story to be where it is but among the theories perhaps it is there to discuss social justice and the cruelty visited upon prisoners. But why ever it is here, it challenges us. John the Baptist was a prophet and prophets, as defined in scripture are **not** people who tell the future but people who show you a truth you might not really want to see. Since the beginning of time we have had prophets. Some tell us how we have allowed ourselves to be corrupted by outside influences. Over the millenniums this is what usually trips up humanity. Too often the prophets were ignored, run out of town or killed. No one really likes to hear what they are doing wrong in the sight of God. But what does this mean for us today? We don’t have a John the Baptist standing in the middle of a river preaching repentance and baptizing people. Today they, just like you and I go about our daily lives living out our faith in the little things we do. Defying modern day heresies by standing fast to the message of love, grace and forgiveness that Jesus taught us. Showing the world, the mirror that reflects the wars, hatred, cruelty and greed that still exists. Today though it may be a bit harder to hear and see the prophets, there are so many claiming to have the prophetic voice of God. But, what about us? Are we prophets? Well, yes just by living out our faith without fear and sharing those uncomfortable truths that Jesus taught us. It is not easy – never was never will be. It can be a time of fear. A time of challenge to stand by the prophecy we reflect. But no matter what may happen to us, God is still in control. He will still use his followers as prophets to reflect his love and grace to a world filled with hate and misunderstandings.
