THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN BRAZIL: PIONEERING IN MISSION

On June 7th, we celebrate and honor the pioneers of the Episcopal Anglican Church of Brazil. It was June 1890 when two Episcopal missionaries from Virginia Theological Seminary: Lucien Lee Kinsolving and James Watson Morris) went to Brazil. As seminarians, they had helped establish Christ Church, Groveton, now St. Mark’s Alexandria, in 1880. They were followed by three more seminarians: William Cabell Brown, John Gaw Meem and Mary Packard. These five Americans partnered with six Brazilians. Together, they founded, organized and established *Igreja Episcopal Anglicana du Brazil (IEAB)*. The partnership in mission bore fruit. In 1899, Kinsolving became its first bishop. In 1907 the Igreja was declared a missionary district of The Episcopal Church and 58 years later, in 1965, it became an autonomous province of the Anglican Communion. Three things are distinctive of the Episcopal Church in Brazil:

Commitment to partnership between missionaries and indigenous people

The five missionaries from Virginia Theological Seminary engaged in partnership in mission with the six local Brazilians to organize the church. The Episcopal missionaries distinguished themselves from their English Anglican counterparts in that they celebrated worship services in Portuguese.

Commitment to the Social Gospel

Brazil is the fifth largest country in the world, with over 200 million citizens. Despite its economic advances, however, the chasm between the rich and poor widens. IEAB rejected advocates that the church should be “an instrument of social change, seeking to engage congregations and communities in debates still considered taboo in Brazilian society,”.

Commitment to Inclusion

The Episcopal Church in Brazil welcomes and embraces people from historically marginalized groups such as LGBT, women, indigenous people and the landless. Enshrined in their canons is a statement "As Christians, we bear the promise of the Holy Spirit, which leads us to the Word made flesh, who welcomes the oppressed, the neglected, the misunderstood and the marginalized". In 2015 celebration was held for the 30th Year of Women’s Ordination in Brazil. The Rev. Bev Weatherly and the Rev. Pat Powers were the first two women Priests to serve the Episcopal Church of Brazil.
